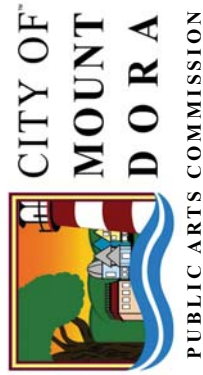

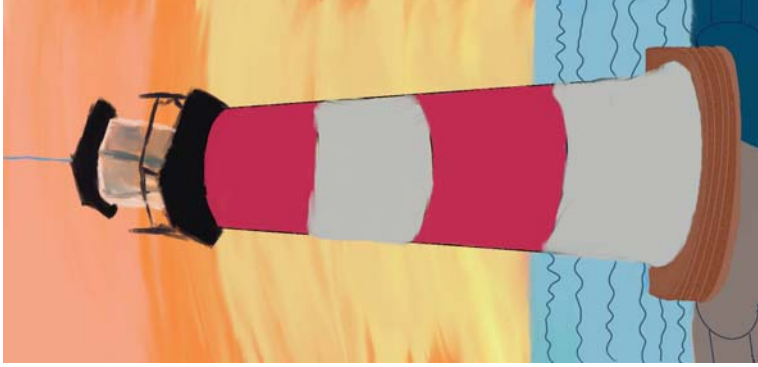

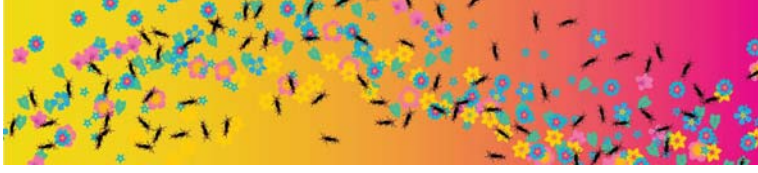

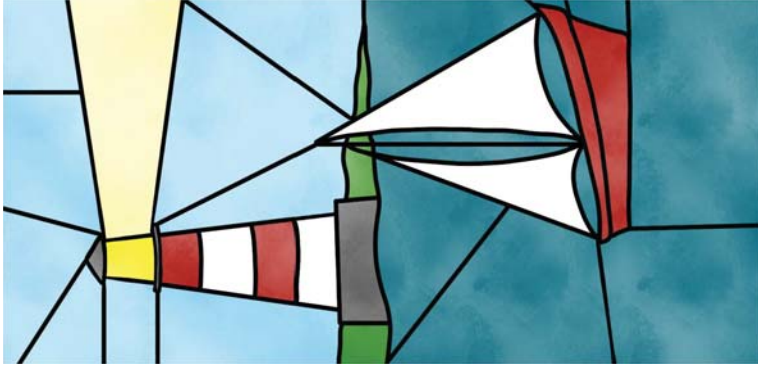

SUBJECT: Donation of Emma Sears Marsh Paintings by the GFWC Mount Dora Woman's Club

Introduction:

Emma Sears Marsh (1871 - 1960) was a Mount Dora artist who painted over 200 detailed watercolors of Florida wildflowers nearly 100 years ago. The Lakes and Hills Garden Club owns 245 of these paintings and until recently the GFWC Mount Dora Woman's Club owned 24. The Woman's Club donated their 24 artworks to the City on February 23, 2022.

Discussion:

Thanks to the generosity of the GFWC Mount Dora Woman's Club, the City now owns 24 original watercolor paintings of Florida wildflowers by Mount Dora artist Emma Sears Marsh. Club President Suzanne Gibson signed a Deed of Gift on February 23, 2022, with the artworks already secured at the Library. The staff plans to have all 24 images professionally scanned at a high resolution and then printed on either canvas or watercolor matte paper. Plans also include writing and printing a biography of Marsh as well as pertinent information about each wildflower, such as its host insects, human uses, time of blooming and prevalence today. The goal is to feature these canvases in the Library's lobby for a month every other year and to also offer them to other Florida museums and libraries as a traveling exhibit.

The watercolors are significant not only as beautiful and botanically accurate renditions of Florida wildflowers, but as careful studies of possibly now-extinct plants. The long-standing lore about the paintings is that they were sought by a university due to their careful study of wildflowers no longer present in Florida. The research and metadata-writing phase of preparation may reveal more details about this.

The Library Advisory Board reviewed this collection on Monday, March 14, 2022 and it is scheduled to be presented to City Council on Tuesday, April 5, 2022. The Library owns a number of artworks by local artists and this collection is a wonderful addition.

Budget Impact:

On February 23, 2022, the Mount Dora Library Association unanimously voted to sponsor the high resolution scanning of these artworks for approximately \$3,000 (GL #001-0000-360.10-01 LIB01 reimbursement and 001-1330-571.52-01 LIB01 expense). There are no other direct costs associated with these paintings.

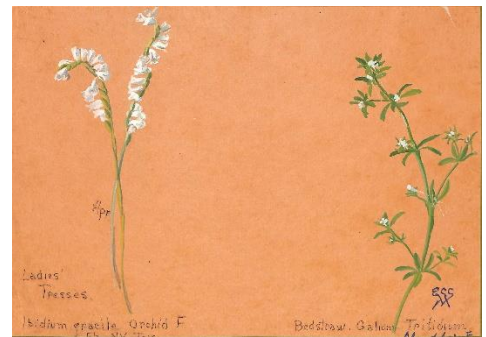
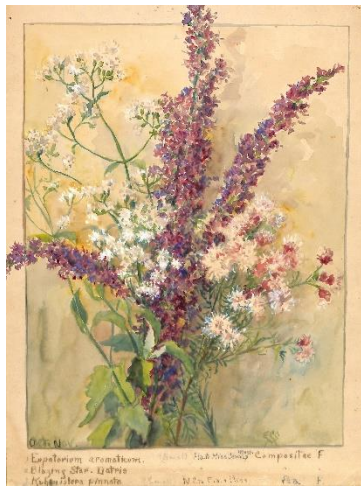

SUBJECT: Approval for Lighting of the Geometric Windmill Sculpture at Elizabeth Evans Park

Introduction:

This is an opportunity for Commissioners to agree upon lighting the Geometric Windmill sculpture that was recently relocated to Elizabeth Evans Park.

Discussion:

At the February 23, 2021 meeting, Commissioners agreed the circle at the end of Edgerton Court was the most favorable place for the relocation of Tom Brewitz's Geometric Windmill sculpture (previously mistakenly referred to by the title Kinetic Windmill). The sculpture had previously been installed at Sunset Park, but was moved as a project of the Public Arts Commission to better highlight this work of art. At the Commission's February 22nd meeting, Commissioner Wesner stated his desire to address the lighting of the sculpture at the March 22nd Commission meeting. Staff members researched lighting solutions and now present the best option to accomplish this goal.

Budget Impact:

Lighting will be funded by the Public Arts Commission. As documented in Attachment 2, the total cost of the lighting will be \$1,458.95, with all material, labor, and tax included.

Strategic Impact:

This item accomplishes Objective 1.4 of the City's Strategic Plan: Enhancing Mount Dora as a Destination.

Recommendation Commissioners agree upon the City's presented solution for lighting the Geometric Windmill sculpture.

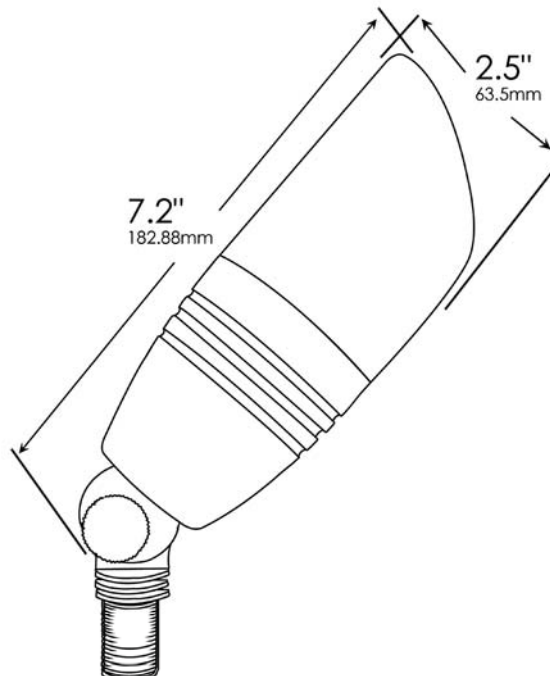

SUBJECT: Waterman Village Bridge Art Detail Confirmation

Introduction:

This is an opportunity for Commissioners to confer with Andrew Dujon of Waterman Village and finalize the details regarding the art to be placed on the bridge.

Discussion:

In May of 2020, representatives from the City's Planning and Zoning Department visited the Commission to solicit input regarding the aesthetic design of a private golf cart bridge that would be constructed over Donnelly Street between properties owned by Waterman Village. Nearly one year later, at the April 2021 meeting, a rendering of the bridge was shown to the Commission and Commissioners discussed aspects of the design that did or did not meet their expectations. Their feedback was shared with Waterman Village via a memo delivered to Andrew Dujon, President and CEO of Waterman Communities. Waterman agreed to work with the Commission to reach a conclusion satisfying all parties involved. At Mr. Dujon's suggestion, Commissioners selected the type and location of art they wish to see installed on the bridge, and described additional features they felt will make the bridge meet their standards of appearance. Commissioners chose plasma cut metal art depicting a heron on one panel and leaves on another panel. Specifically, the Commissioners requested

- No art on the walls leading up either side of the bridge.
- Art created by a local artist.
- Sufficient lighting, including backlighting, for effective display of the metal art beneath the bridge span and the "Welcome to Mount Dora" message, for best effect at nighttime.
- Decorative landscaping, including palm trees, with an emphasis on height.

Mr. Dujon agreed to work toward meeting their expectations, yet explained measures could not exceed Waterman's budget for the project.

See Attachment 1 for a summary of the requests made by the Public Arts Commission.

The "Welcome to Mount Dora" message recently installed on the bridge has been met with complaints that it is difficult to read. Commission members wish to address this matter as well when meeting with Mr. Dujon on March 22.

Budget Impact:

As per the PUD arts contribution requirements, \$150,000 will be recognized either in the form of the value of the constructed gateway or by monetary contribution.

Strategic Impact:

The "Welcome to Mount Dora" gateway passing over Donnelly Street is a valued addition to infrastructure, serving as a celebrated entry into the City near a major intersection.

Recommendation Commissioners and Waterman agree upon final design details for the bridge.

Public Arts Commission members are among those who have been consulted regarding the bridge's design.

After the Commission expressed dissatisfaction with a bridge design presented at their April 2021 meeting, Mr. Dujon attended their May meeting, along with Waterman representative Roger Reeves and Mount Dora CRA Administrator Adam Sumner, to discuss solutions to Commission's objections.

It was mutually decided that the Commission would arrive at a consensus regarding their suggested revisions to the bridge's design. They would then submit their agreed upon requests to Mr. Dujon.

After discussion their last meeting, the solutions below were unanimously approved by the Commission on June 22, 2021.

Recommendation:

- "Welcome to Mount Dora" message in Times New Roman font. (One font throughout entire message).
- No art on the walls leading up either side to the bridge.
- Plasma cut metal art (see photos below) on both walls along Donnelly Street beneath the bridge span.
 - o Different art design on each side beneath the bridge.
 - o Pieces shown in photos below are examples of what Commission members would like to see. Selected artist would create their own design.
 - o Commission members to review artist's proposed designs and dimensions of proposed art to give input on final design.
- Suggested art to be created by a local artist.
- Sufficient lighting, to include backlighting, for effective display of the metal art beneath the bridge span and the "Welcome to Mount Dora" message, for best effect at nighttime.

- Decorative landscaping to include palm trees, with an emphasis on height.
